# O'MATHLON COMPETITION

Well done to our teams from years 5-8 who competed in the O'Mathlon last week. Thank you to the parents who helped with transport and supervision. The O'Mathlon is a team problem solving competition held at the Edgar Centre. Teams of four children from the same year level compete against teams from schools round Otago attempting to solve as many mathematical problems as they can in the allotted time. Teams are given two questions in a sealed envelope at the beginning of the competition and begin working on these (usually simultaneously in pairs). An element of athletics is added as they run around a circuit to a designated marker who tells them if their solution is correct or incorrect. Correct answers result in a point and a new question being given to the team. Incorrect answers require the runner to make a choice between passing or returning to their team to rework the solution. It is an intense and exciting competition!
