

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS ON HILLARY STREET NEXT WEEK

On Monday the work to tighten up the Hillary Street / Pine Hill Road intersection will start. This will cause significant disruption to drop off and pick up at our school as the intersection will be closed for 2-3 weeks. You will have the option of dropping off on Pine Hill Road to use the walkway entrance or driving further along to Lowe Street and accessing Hillary Street from the other end and then driving back out via Lowe Street.

There is also work scheduled to redo the footpath on the school side of Hillary Street.

Thank you for helping keep all students safe at the school gate at 3pm, by not parking on the yellow lines or over the main gate area.

We continue to remind our junior children (Years 1-4) that they must not leave the school grounds without an adult or older sibling alongside them.

THANK YOU AND LEAVERS ASSEMBLY


